PRAYER CYCLE:

The feast of The Baptism of the Lord this Sunday marks the close of the Christmas Season. This is followed by Ordinary Time (Winter), which goes up to the start of Lent. During this time we are asked to pray for these intentions: Peace on Earth; Christian Unity; the Sick and their Carers; Victims of Trafficking and those who work to combat it; Students & Teachers; the Unemployed.

BAPTISMS IN 2014

On this feast of the Baptism of The Lord we remember, especially at 11 a.m. Mass, all who were baptised at St Columba's last year. We welcome them again to our parish community and ask God's blessing on their journey of faith. Please keep them and their families in your prayers.

FEAST OF THE WEEK - EPIPHANY:

- Monday: St. Aelred of Rievaulx. Born in 1110, the son of a priest in Hexham and educated in Durham. In 1134 he became a monk at the newly-founded Cistercian abbey of Rievaulx, Yorkshire. Some time later he was appointed abbot of Revesby in Lincolnshire but was then recalled to be abbot at Rievaulx. Under his rule the abbey prospered to become the largest in England, making five further foundations in England and Scotland. He was the author of many writings, including a life of Edward the Confessor. He died on this day in 1167.
- Tuesday: **St. Hilary.** Born in Poitiers in 315, died there on this day in 368. He was a married man with a family who became a Christian and was elected bishop of his native city. He was strong in his defence of the divinity of Christ against the Arians and in developing understanding of the trinity. He was named as a Doctor of the church. In Britain and Ireland his feast day marks the start of the Hilary Term at the Law Courts and some universities.
- Saturday: **St. Anthony.** Born in 251 in upper Egypt, Anthony died in 356. He gave away his possessions and sought the austere life of the desert at an early age. He attracted disciples who formed communities of hermits, and he is venerated as the father of monasticism.
